Spring Festivals

This is always an exciting time of year for any National Hunt trainer, and it's no different for us. We aim to build our horses up to peak in the spring. While Cheltenham and Aintree are the headline meetings, there are plenty of other valuable targets, including Ayr, Haydock, Punchestown, and the Go North Series races at Carlisle, Kelso, and Musselburgh.



Judicial Deference

The horses have remained in good form since our last newsletter, with several pleasing winners. **Judicial Deference** has been a standout-winning a novice hurdle at Musselburgh before following up in a handicap at Haydock Park, an impressive achievement for an inexperienced horse. He then won at Kelso to qualify for a race at the **Punchestown Festival**. All being well, he'll go to Ireland for the final which is very exciting for us and the owners. He has been an excellent purchase, finishing second on debut before winning his next three. His toughness and willingness make him a pleasure to train.

We purchased a beautiful mare, **Halftheworldaway** at the Punchestown Sales after she finished second in an Irish point-to-point. She is a big, scopey mare who should make a chaser in time. After finishing fourth in a bumper, she has progressed well over hurdles-finishing third, second, and then winning nicely at Bangor. She has taken time to mature, but it is now coming together, and she will be a very nice horse for the future.

Aboutdamntime

We continue to source horses from the flat to go hurdling, although this market has become increasingly competitive. Dan Astbury, who buys all our horses, is always on the lookout for less obvious stars and **Word For Word** is a good example of finding value - his flat form was modest, but he had size and shape as though he would improve over hurdles. That proved correct when he won impressively at Kelso, travelling strongly and showing a touch of class despite a couple of mistakes. He is an exciting prospect, though the next step may be tougher under a penalty.

Aboutdamntime continues to progress and has always shaped like a staying chaser. He runs well fresh and won at Ludlow last time, despite a dramatic race. After losing position, he rallied strongly to lead before the straight, then hung right at the last, nearly allowing the runner-up past. He held on to win the feature race and avoided a steep handicap rise by not winning by too far.



Word For Word

It is always special to have winners at local tracks, so it was particularly pleasing to see **Ki Woo** win at Haydock for the Haydock Park Racing Club. Since arriving from France, he has won twice over hurdles and now over fences. Though not the biggest, he is very tough and determined. After finishing second at Doncaster, he jumped superbly at Haydock Park to win comfortably, delighting his enthusiastic group of owners. This club does have some spaces in it and includes full annual Haydock membership with its own room for their meetings if anyone would be interested in joining.



Bravethewaves

Bravethewaves has been a star. When the ground isn't too soft, he is very hard to beat and recently won well at Doncaster, a track he clearly enjoys. Bred by Steve and Chris Adams, he is now shared with a local syndicate who have had great fun with him. He should continue to perform well through the spring.

Guet Apens

Guet Apens, another recruit from the flat (formerly with Godolphin), has impressed at home and translated that to the track. After a strong debut at Musselburgh, he won convincingly at Carlisle. He is straightforward, enjoys his jumping, and looks a horse with plenty of potential.



Las Canals

We have also had success sourcing horses from France. **Las Canals** arrived with a strong recommendation from his former trainer, Louisa Carberry, and although disappointing on debut for us at Hereford, he benefited from the patience of his owners and won well at Sedgefield from a difficult position. He showed a powerful finishing effort to come from off the pace and beat a short-priced favourite.



Forcetoreckonwith

Some horses take time to settle into a new environment, and **Forcetoreckonwith** was one of those. We also took time to find her ideal trip, but she is now progressing well. She won nicely at Newcastle, jumping fluently and travelling strongly before idling slightly late on. She should improve further as she steps up in trip.

Iroko and Jagwar

Cheltenham Week is always a highlight of the season, and having two runners in the same race made it especially exciting-if a little nerve-racking.

Jagwar ran an excellent race to finish second. He can be tricky, and although Mark Walsh rode him well, he felt afterwards that he might have done things differently with more familiarity. The Old Course didn't suit him well as it is a very tight track and he was forced wide and his jumping came under pressure, but his strong finish highlighted his ability.

Iroko was below form, likely due to a combination of the ground and the tight track. We will get him right, and both horses could potentially head to the Grand National - another exciting prospect.

Tim Molony

Winning the Tim Molony Memorial Race at Haydock Park with **Ki Woo** was particularly meaningful given our family connection. Tim was based in Leicestershire, and his family were close to mine.

Tim's brother Martin was champion Jump Jockey in Ireland for 6 consecutive seasons before he was forced to retire early at 26 through injury. Tim was born in 1919 and was successful in his own right, being a considerable force in National Hunt racing and a specialist over fences and hurdles. Like his brother, he received a rigorous horsemanship education in Ireland prior to moving to England where he was deeply influenced by the professional standards of the British training yards of the 1940s.

Tim Molony was one of the leading National Hunt jockeys of his era, winning five British Champion Jockey titles between 1948 and 1955. Riding at a time when the sport was even more dangerous than today, he was renowned for his skill, judgement, and toughness, consistently riding over 100 winners per season.

He is best remembered for his partnership with Sir Ken, with whom he won three consecutive Champion Hurdles at Cheltenham (1952–1954). Although he never won the Gold Cup or Grand National, he was highly regarded for his ability over fences, particularly at Aintree.

After retiring, Tim became a trainer in Leicestershire, enjoying further success. Alongside his brother Martin, he was part of a remarkable family that helped shape post-war jump racing.

Known for his modest nature, Molony passed away in 1989 but remains a significant figure in the sport's history. He was known as 'The Iron Man' and helped define the modern professional jump jockey.

His nephew, Peter, now runs Rathmore Stud in Ireland and has always been a great supporter of ours.

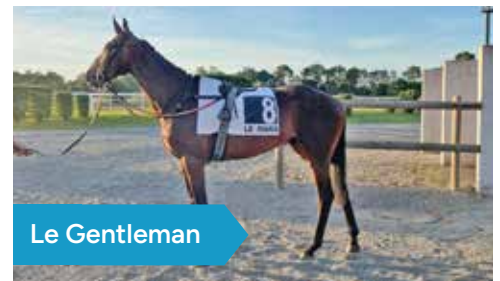
Racing Club Prize Draw
